We who remain on deck are thinking of you and looking forward to seeing you all back again when the wave has gone by! Meanwhile we'll try to keep you up-to-date via emails and notes.

WaiCom (Waikanae Committee) welcomes Desmond Corrigan, our latest member. Desmond has been doing a lot of work around the church and grounds and his long and steady progress has spruced up the whole property remarkably. Thanks Desmond for your time and commitment.

Our Friday Playgroup has a new supervisor, whom we all look forward to seeing in action next term. The playground equipment stolen from the church backyard has not been recovered, but some good second-hand replacements have been donated by Waikanae Montessori Preschool. Thanks, Montessori!

Harvest Service was led by Syd Mepham, and enjoyed by all. Dianna baked a Kringle loaf; sort of bread/cake with fruit and nuts. It was very tasty and I understand that someone who won't be named ate five pieces! Now I don't feel guilty for having three. (A plate is recommended, as a mangled kringle may dangle while you tangle with it).

When is a door not a door? This year's property maintenance has begun, as planned several procrastinations ago. Round one is the entrance foyer, now almost complete. The rear entrance doors are redundant and haven't been used for decades: however, rust never sleeps and the salt air had all- but destroyed everything metal. Desmond and Ian took the

doors off and removed all fossilised metal including the hinges, then sealed and permanently fixed them back in place. Some wooden trim tidied up the inside and made it all draft - and leak - tight. Then the whole foyer interior was repainted a light cream colour. Removing old curtains and rusty track completed the tidy-up. All that remains to be done is to weatherproof-trim the exterior.

The next post-procrastination job is to erect a new child-proof fence in the back yard. As well as replacing the ancient, rotting "temporary" fence that was erected in the Jurassic period, this will have the additional benefit of hiding the play equipment from view from the road. Wonky the Walnut Tree

Sadly it has proven necessary to cut down the walnut tree between the Raumati church hall and Thrifty Place. It has long been popular for the walnuts it provided, and for the welcome shade in summer for barbeques and Parish fairs.

However, advice from an arborist revealed that the tree had become extremely unstable and presented a threat to both the hall and Thrifty Place.

Moreover, tree debris was falling on the Thrifty Place roof and in the gutters, and the steps at the rear of the hall were shaded – they will now dry more quickly, making them less prone to algal growth and reducing the chance of the steps being slippery.

The decision to remove the tree quickly while the ground was dry - thus ensuring minimal damage to the lawns around the tree by the contractor's truck and large limbs falling - was made at the March Property and Finance Committee meeting chaired by Cathy Drummond, and was approved by the Kapiti Uniting Parish Chairperson, Mary White.

The Orchard Joinery team suggests there may be a wood turner on the Coast who would appreciate some of the wood, which is stacked beside the storage shed at Thrifty Place.

Firewood Available

Some of the wood will need to be cut into smaller pieces, before being used as firewood.

This should be done within the next four weeks while the lawns are firm. Parishioners should have 'first dibs' on the wood. However, REMEMBER – first in best dressed!

Trees alongside Church driveway and ramp

The contractors also cut back the two Kowhai trees alongside the Church driveway ramp and the silver birch at the front. This will reduce gutter contamination and reduce algae and lichen on the brickwork.
